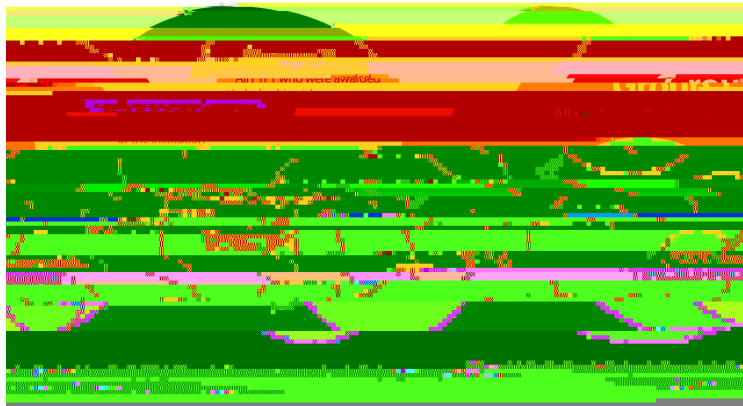

Consult the instructions and screens to make sure you are reporting the correct aid amounts for the correct groups of students.


- College Affordability and Transparency Lists**
